



Flood Insurance

The Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012 is going to affect everyone in Broadwater to some extent. There is an effort to delay the implementation of the bill to allow time for an economic impact study. This is not a done deal so be sure to contact your elected officials and let them know the economic consequences that loom if this is not revised. The act is designed to gradually eliminate subsidized rates in order to properly fund the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). New buyers are subject to the highest rates. While this may not affect you directly, if it affects your neighbors, it could have an adverse effect on the value of your home by decreasing the resale value of surrounding homes. This could also lead to increased foreclosures because the required coverage is not affordable. You should consult your insurance agent to see how your property will be affected and in most cases obtain a certificate of elevation. You may want to get together with your neighbors and see if you can get a discounted rate for a certificate by using a common contractor. FLOOD INSURANCE

The new rates and when they will go into effect is still up in the air. Bills have been introduced in the U.S. House and Senate which would defer rate increases until FEMA completes the affordability study mandated by law. The bills would create a system for targeted rate relief, and would create an office of the Advocate for flood insurance rate and mapping concerns.

To reduce your premium, have you considered a higher deductible? Also, check with your insurance agent on grandfathering - some agents are proactive and have been effective in grandfathering with maps on file in their office. Did you know that if you do not have a mortgage that you are not required to have flood insurance?

Some of us received "take out" notices from Homeowners Choice insurance. They have stated their intention to offer flood insurance as an endorsement for their homeowner's policies.

It's still too soon to know what effect, if any, new flood insurance rates will have on property prices. Only two Broadwater waterfront homes have gone to contract and closed since October 1st. Both were cash purchases, according to the MLS.

STATISTICS

It's important to know what areas and criteria are used when you look at statistics. A flyer recently mailed to homes in the area implied that for a 3 month period this year the average price dropped 18%. It seems as though the data included Bayway Isles sales one year, and not the next, so the assumption made from that data was not accurate.

Looking at real comparisons, from January 1st to November 15th this year:

- The median Broadwater waterfront sales price went up 2.5%
- The average Broadwater waterfront sales price went up 10%
- The number of Broadwater waterfront sales went up 40%

There were 7 non-waterfront Broadwater home sales during that period this year, but since there was only one sold during that period in 2012, there isn't enough data to show a trend.

Wood Worm

Anyone who has a dock or boat lift needs to be aware of a worm that eats away at your wood pilings. Several Broadwater neighbors have experienced this and it can cause costly damage and safety hazards. Teredo navalis has an elongated, reddish, wormlike body which is completely enclosed in a tunnel it has made in floating or submerged timber. At the front end of the animal are two triangular, calcareous plates. These are up to 2 cm (0.8 in) long and correspond to the valves of other bivalve mollusks. They are white and pale brown and have rough ridges. The mollusk uses them to rasp the wood and slowly enlarges the burrow in which it lives. The damage is done below the waterline and can cause a hazard that you may not see until it is too late. Be sure to check your pilings for excessive play and have them inspected if you suspect they may be infected. If you are having new pilings installed

you should make sure the contractor wraps them. This will save you money in the long run.



Warm Days, Cold Water, Oh No!

Our beautiful "winter" weather is finally here, with cool nights and warm, sunny afternoons. Unless a pool is heated, the water at this time of the year is just too cold to jump in and enjoy! What are the options to warm up that chilly water and extend your swimming season? There are a few, and this is a good time of the year to touch upon this subject especially with many of us having company coming for the holidays!

One of the easiest and least expensive ways to increase your pool water temperature is to use a solar blanket. A solar blanket is placed on top of the water and works by absorbing sunlight during the day and preventing heat loss at night when the temperatures drop. People ask us "How much can we expect the water temperature to go up with the use of a solar blanket?". How effective this option will be for you will depend on a number of factors, especially your pool location (sunny or shady, waterfront or non-waterfront).

Another option to warm up your pool water is the use of a Gas Heater or Electric Heat Pump. If you have natural gas or propane, you can use a Gas Heater. Gas heaters heat the water very quickly, and are most energy efficient for heating a pool for a short period of time (for example, you only swim on weekends). They have a lower upfront cost but the gas cost can be high depending on how much you use it. If you plan to heat your pool continuously, an Electric Heat Pump may be the better option. Heat pumps have a higher upfront cost but will be more energy efficient and can cost you less in the long run. Some people opt for the environmentally friendly Solar Systems. In a solar heating system, panels are installed either on your roof or on a sunny side of your home and the pool water circulates through them. The panels use the natural energy of the sun to heat the water! Although the installation cost of a solar heating system is high, there are no additional energy costs to factor in and many homeowners choose this option.

There are a lot of factors to consider when choosing the best method to heat your pool, and we are here to answer your questions and help you make the best decision. We wish everyone Happy Holidays and the best for a Happy New Year!

Treasurer's Report

Cash and Certificates of Deposit total \$38,785. Revenues year-to-date through November 2, 2013 of \$13,524 compared to \$11,758 for the same period last year. 2013 year-to-date advertising income reflects favorably to 2012 by \$1,500. 2013 year-to date expenses of \$9,211 compared to \$8,221 for the same period last year. The 2013 year-to-date expenditures include \$540 charged to membership for communication signage and \$450 of expense reimbursement for prior year expenses.

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


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
