Treasurer's Report

Cash and Certificates of Deposit total \$39,169. Revenues year-to-date through July 29, 2014 of \$12,780 compared to \$9,811 for the same period last year. The increase is primarily due to an increase in advertising receipts.

2014 year-to date expenses of \$8,452 compare to \$6,550 for the same period last year. The 2014 year-to-date expenditures include \$500 for a donation to Skyway Marina District, Inc. and \$1,439 for street sign repairs. Thank you to all who have paid their 2014 dues! Are you a Race Car or a Jalopy What are your tires like?

For the final article in this car-themed series, I am focusing attention on your tires and wheels. As you know, a car cannot function properly without good tires with an appropriate amount of tread to match the desired performance. If the tires are not correct for the conditions, or the tread is worn, the tires and wheels become imbalanced. Bad tires can also lead to major and immediate damage.

Making the analogy to your body, your shoes are critical to your performance and are a significant factor in your overall health and body alignment. Watching the waves of current shoe trends (to include flip flops, wedges and stilettos), it is clear that most people are not caring for their feet properly. Not to mention we need to be paying very close attention to wear and tear and replacing shoes when needed, particularly those used for athletic activities. From the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons' Web article "Shoes: Finding the Right Fit":

The average person will walk thousands of miles over a lifetime. Unfortunately, many of these miles will be walked in uncomfortable shoes that do not fit properly. Shoes that are too tight, too loose, or without enough support, can lead to unwanted stress on the feet, ankles, lower leg, hip, and spine. This ongoing pressure can cause pain and injuries that may limit or prevent participation in work, sports, and hobbies. According to the National Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NAMCS), nearly 7 million Americans visited a doctor for foot-and toe-related discomfort in 2009. Fortunately, many foot-related problems can be prevented with shoes that are appropriate for an individual's feet, body, and lifestyle. http://orthoinfo.aaos.org/topic.cfm?topic=A00143. When you think about how much work our feet have to endure on a daily basis and the weight they sustain, it is amazing how much we neglect their care! Our feet are our foundation and the building blocks from which our body alignment begins. I encourage you to pay attention to them and take preventative measures before experiencing injury to your feet, knees, back, etc. And very importantly, change your tires (even though it can be painful to part with your favorite worn shoes) when needed!

THE SHACK AT THE END OF THE DOCK

It's been in business for almost three years. We've walked, driven or biked by the sign almost every day, but in September we finally took the short walk down the main dock at the marina to Maximo Seafood Shack, where purport-

edly one can find the "Best Grouper Sandwich in the Bay!" The menu is limited, but includes the famous grouper sandwich with fries or coleslaw, clams on the half shell, grouper bites, fried scallops, steamed shrimp, homemade fish spread, with cost ranging from \$10.00 to \$20.00. The added advantage is that the Shack sells beer and wine.



Unique outdoor places to enjoy your food & drinks

There's a lot going on in this small space. In addition to the lunch/ dinner meals, there is an assortment of fresh fish (grouper, snapper,

warm water lobster tails, shrimp, crab, clams, fresh catch-of-the-day) available from the cold case, as well as a homemade fresh fish spread. You may remember a similar offering from

Capt. Mike, owner of the previous tenant, Castaway's Fish House.

The Shack is also home to St. Pete Heat, a unique product line of fresh hot

sauces, rubs and spices, with names like, Killer Carrot, Hell Screamin' Habanero, Garlic Sniper, Heat Wave ... to name just a few. There is "heat and sunshine packed in every package".

Margaret Covello, the owner, is a Pinellas Point resident. She told me she plans to remain open during the Maximo Marina renovations and has

no plans as yet for any expansion. She has kept a charming old Florida look to her establishment, decorating with lights and Caribbean Island flags strung 'round the ceiling. Even after the marina is modernized, Margaret plans to keep the same look and feel, a comfortable place where you can come as you are, sit inside or out, and just enjoy the food, drink, vistas and sunshine. She tells me there is usually at least one slip available

> right in front of the entrance where you can park your boat while patronizing the Shack.

Broadwater is well represented, with groups of neighbors hanging out together So, if you haven't already done so, wander on down to the end of the dock, say hello to neighbors and be surprised!

OUTDOOR LIVING

We certainly know how important outdoor living space is here in Broadwater, but it's a national trend, too. According to a study done by the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA), today's homeowners are looking for outdoor home landscapes that allow for entertaining and relaxing outside.

According to the study, the most popular outdoor features are gardens and landscapes (94.2%), outdoor living spaces such as kitchen and entertainment areas (92%) and recreation areas (75.8%).

Nancy Somerville, ASLA Executive Vice President and CEO says "Homeowners . . . are interested in livable, open spaces that are both stylish and earth friendly." Most of our homes in Broadwater make the most of outdoor space, so we completely understand!

UPSIZING

Florida REALTOR magazine reports that homes are getting bigger. They're referring to data from the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) that shows the average size of new homes keeps increasing. In fact, the average new home size has risen from 2,362 sq ft

The Market is Moving!

What a difference 60 days can make (if you got an estimated price 3 months ago for your home, that may not be what it is now). Since the end of June, three waterfront homes have closed and there are currently 7 active waterfront listings and 2 non-waterfront listings.

The average sale price for waterfront homes has risen from \$411,244 to \$455,996. The average listing price for the 4 homes listed since the end of June is \$599,475. We've talked about statistics before remember that this doesn't mean a particular home has increased this much. It's all about the mix. The first half of the year included two distress sales; two of the three sales since then have been over 2,500 sq ft and have sold at or above \$500,000.

On a broader scale, July was slower than usual, while August has been busier. We've seen some record sales in downtown St Pete condominiums. Construction cranes and pile drivers are again populating downtown. Construction crews are also at work on renovations in Broadwater.



The Pinellas County Property Appraiser's Office

has sent out the new assessed value for tax purposes. In the random properties I've checked in the neighborhood, the just market value has increased by 10% to 18%. If you want to dispute the value you need to contact the Appraiser's office immediately. You have 25 days from when the notice was mailed out to file a petition with the Value Adjustment Board. Most disputes are settled in a meeting at the appraiser's office before that.

in 2009 to 2,679 sq ft in 2013. On the same track, the number of new homes with at least four bedrooms has risen from 34% to 48% in the same time frame.

That logic also seems to apply to remodels in neighborhoods like ours, with many homeowners opting to enclose Florida rooms and expand their living space.

"Backyards" Broadwater

There are surely larger and more elaborate backyards in Broadwater but this backyard (based on detail, design layout, and utilization of Travertine tiles and Old Chicago bricks) is hard to beat!

The front yard is immaculate and features a circular driveway of Old Chicago bricks giving the casual observer a hint of what might be behind the house.



It all started back in September 2013 when Thom and Becky Burton decided they wanted a custom hot tub. That idea escalated into a chain of events that led the Burtons to a consultation with Tommy Todd Landscape & Design. Between the Burtons and the company, this well-integrated co-design was born! Four months and many \$\$\$ later, it was complete!





We started our tour on a screenedin lanai and pool overlooking the backyard and waterfront dock. Leaving this area brings a visitor to a walkway on the upper terrace of Travertine marble. Graceful marble steps lead to a lower level flush with the seawall and dock.

This backyard is designed as if every square foot was carved out of a monolith of Travertine marble. It is accented by numerous steps, multiple terraces, and punctuated with creative LED lighting. There was no blade of grass to be seen but manicured and carefully-chosen tropical landscaping everywhere.



The custom fire pit, fed by piped-in propane from a remote 200 gallon tank, is made of Old Chicago bricks. The pit is topped with glass beads that create a mesmerizing glow when the fire pit is being used.
