You have probable noticed the yellow signs on some of the bicycles riding by your house or vehicles with **Broadwater Neighborhood Watch** signs driving around your neighborhood. It's a great way to get exercise or to get out and meet your Broadwater neighbors, at the same time help deter crime in the neighborhood. Health and Wellness Column

Are you a Race Car or a Jalopy? Article #1 - Fuel

I must tart out by offering my apologies to those who have an affinity for jalopies; they do bring back many fun childhood memories! However, I think you will agree they are not the most shapely,

speedy or star performer type vehicles around. When I work with personal training clients, I talk to them about choices and their goals in relation to what they are willing to do to accomplish those goals. First and foremost, before even talking about exercise, it is essential to consider the fuel that is going into the body. I ask people whether they would rather look and function like a race car or a jalopy. As I would expect the general response is "race car." The follow up questions are, "if you owned a race car, would you fill it with low grade fuel? Allow it to run out of gas? Overfill the gas tank? Get up in the middle of the night and get more fuel?" I would expect the response to be "no" or at least "not on purpose" to all of those questions. Let's bring that analogy back to our bodies.

If we want our body to function and look like a race car, we have to treat it like one starting with the fuel. High grade fuel (non-processed food) is so essential to keeping our systems working at their best and keeping our filters from clogging. Avoiding "running on empty" will regulate blood sugar and allow us to operate efficiently without leaving us desperately seeking relief (often junk food and simple sugars) to satisfy our immediate need. Not "overfilling" your gas tank and eating at inopportune times will also keep those extra calories at bay and keep you at full throttle. Most of us have been trained to eat for various reasons including for emotional, social and habitual reasons. If you want to be a race car, consider eating for one reason and one reason only – to properly fuel your body for the next race. Keep this in mind each time you reach for that fuel nozzle, and decide whether you want to look and perform like a race car or a jalopy!

Is Your Boat Safe?

- ✓ Does your boat have the required equipment to qualify as a "safe boat"?
- ✓ Does your first mate know what to do if the captain becomes disabled while underway in your boat?
- ✓ Does your boat have a 2014 Vessel Safety Check decal? 2014 VESSEL SAFETY CHECK DECALS are available.
- ✓ Have you taken an approved safe boating class (Boating Skills and Seamanship Course)?
- Do all of your boat operators who were born after January 1, 1988 have a Florida Boating Safety Identification Card if they are operating a motorboat with 10 horsepower or more?

To certify that your boat is safe, a U.S. Coast Guard Vessel Examiner will check specific items (based on the size of your vessel) for a successful completion of a Vessel Safety Check (VSC) and on completion, the vessel is issued a Vessel Safety Check decal for the current year. Items checked are:

Common requirements:

Display of Numbers, Registration/Documentation, Visual Distress Signals (VDSs) and Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs) (Some requirements include: PFDs must be US Coast Guard approved and in good condition. A wearable PFD of suitable size is required for each person on the boat (suggested but not required: with whistle and mirror attached). In Florida waters, children under 6 years of age on any vessel less than 26 feet must wear a properly fitted PFD. PFDs must be immediately available and not be stored in unopened plastic packaging.)

Some requirements for larger boats include:

Min. of 3 day/night flares are required. Check yours and be certain to have on board VDSs that have not expired! Fire Extinguishers, Sound Producing Devices, Navigation Lights, Pollution Placard, MARPOL Trash Placard, Ventilation, Backfire Flame Control, Marine Sanitation Devices, Navigation Rules (a publication by USCG) and Mufflers (All Florida vessel engines must be equipped with an effective muffling device. The use of any type of exhaust cutout that allows exhaust to bypass the engine muffling system is prohibited.), It is recommended that you also have on board a basic first aid kit, extra drinking water, a VHF-FM radio, an emergency position indicator radio beacon, and basic tools. When you enroll in a USCG Auxiliary Boating Skills & Seamanship Course, you will learn more safety specifics and receive a Florida Boater's Guide booklet (and Florida fish guide) with all the current boating laws and responsibilities. If your boat does not pass, no citation is issued. Instead, you are provided a written report on how to correct any discrepancies. A BS&S program is taught by USCGAux Flotilla 78 at the Warren Webster Building, 1500 Pass-A-Grille Way, St. Pete Beach, FL 33706, near the Don Cesar. This program is held every Tuesday evening at 7:00 PM on a 13-week cycle year round; join anytime and complete within 2 years. Effect of Flood Insurance on Sales

There has been some concern about the effect that flood insurance rates is having on sales. The effect seems to be in the number of sales rather than the price of sales. Some buyers are not willing to look in a flood zone. From October 1 to December 31 of last year, all three sales were cash. The two sales so far this year, one waterfront and one non-waterfront, were both financed. Interestingly, the flood insurance for the waterfront sale I had was less than the seller had been paying. Current quotes I've seen

in the neighborhood have ranged from less than 1,000/year to nearly 4,000/year. As far as I know, the 40,000+/yr quotes have been on the beaches.

According to Multiple Listing Service statistics, there were 104 waterfront sales in south Pinellas County between October 1, 2013 and February 15, 2014. During the sale period a year before, there were 567 waterfront sales in south Pinellas County - that means only 18% of last year's sales.

Statistically Speaking

These figures show the current market and the recent Broadwater sales history according to the Multiple Listing Service (MLS). Prices vary by size, condition and location, so the \$/square feet has a tremendous range and is *"nice to know"* rather than a useful criteria.

The ghosts and goblins have left, turkey leftovers are tucked neatly in the freezer, and Christmas decorations are 75% off. Summer is right around the corner!! This is the time of year when many of our grasses, plants, and ornamentals wake up from their state of dormancy...and also the time of year when many homeowners begin to consider hiring a lawn service to help maintain their beautiful properties. Most homeowners are fully aware of the importance and requirements of licensing and insurance when hiring a contractor to provide a service, but unfortunately, these requirements are not as clear when it comes to lawn care providers. Contrary to popular belief, in Pinellas County, lawn care providers are not required to carry a certain type of "license". These service providers ARE required to possess certain "certifications". According to Pinellas County Ordinance #10-06, lawn care providers and their employees are required to carry the Florida Green Industries Best Management Practices (GI-BMP) certification.

"The GI-BMPs are a science-based educational program for Green Industry workers (lawn-care and landscape maintenance professionals), brought to you by UF-IFAS Florida-Friendly Landscaping[™] program. The GI-BMPs teach environmentally safe landscaping practices that help conserve and protect Florida's ground and surface waters. They can also save the Florida homeowner money, time, and effort; increase the beauty of the home landscape; and protect the health of your family, pets, and the environment." This program is geared towards reducing environmental stresses by training best practices for Landscape Installation, Lawn Care and Maintenance, Irrigation (Installation and Maintenance), Fertilization, and Disposal.

Improper lawn care practices can have a tremendously damaging effect on the environment, especially in coastal areas. Pinellas County requires several different certifications, depending on the services provided. These regulations and certifications are of great benefit to the industry, customers, and most importantly the environment. More information regarding certifications and requirements can be found at www.pinellascounty.org Insurance, more importantly level of coverage, is another important component of a lawn care provider's service. Being insured is more than just stating "Insured" on a business card. Always ask a potential provider for a certificate of insurance, and check the coverage levels to insure that it is sufficient according to the service they are providing.

It is always a good idea to do a little research before selecting any contractor...lawn care providers included! Don't be afraid to ask for proof of certifications, insurance certificates, business licensing, and references. Properly accredited providers will never be offended and will be more than happy to provide this information. Spring Pool Care

After a cold, rainy and oftentimes foggy winter, we are all happy that Spring is here and our pools can be used again! For many pool owners, pool care and maintenance has not been high on the priority list. Now is the time to get the pool in shape to avoid algae problems and ensure safe swimming. The first thing you should do is test the water to see what needs to be balanced. We offer free water tests here at the store if you don't have a pool test kit. If you have a chlorine sanitized pool, now is the time to start shocking the pool weekly with liquid chlorine if you haven't been doing so. For those salt pool owners, it is critical that you have enough salt in the pool to produce the chlorine you need for sanitization purposes. Now is also the time to take a good look at your filter. If you have a cartridge filter, inspect it to see if it is clean and in good condition. If not, now is a good time to replace it. For sand filters, a good backwash will ensure clear water. For those DE filter owners, now is the time to open the filter up and rinse off the grids (we call this a "split and clean") and then repopulate the pool with DE. It is recommended that this be done twice a year for best water clarity and filter performance, and we suggest spring and fall as the best times to do this maintenance.

If you haven't been brushing your pool and removing debris, get those brushes and nets out! Don't forget to check your pump and skimmer baskets and empty them if necessary. Take a good look (and listen to) your pump to make sure that it is running properly and quietly. And, if you cut back on the amount of time you ran your pump during the winter, now is the time to have it back to normal run time of 8 hours. We wish everyone an enjoyable spring, and we are here to help if you have any questions or problems getting your pool back to perfect!
