Neighborhood Garage Sale

In order to keep a lane clear on 46th Ave. we ask that you inform shoppers not to park on the north side of 46th Ave S. We will be proactive in trying to control the traffic on 46th Ave S but we ask that you be patient on March 5th as you drive through the neighborhood.

Debris In Our Waters Are You Aware?



Many of our landscapers routinely blow grass clippings and other yard debris into our waters and streets. Did you know that no matter where this happens in Broadwater the debris will end up in our canals and Boca Ciega Bay? Did you know that fines up to \$10,000 can be levied for allowing yard debris, grass

clippings or pet waste to enter our waters even via street drains? This type of activity can contribute to algae blooms that lead to red tide and frankly make our canals ugly! Your lawn service is required to know these facts as well. In fact they are required to obtain a Best Management Practices (BMP) certification to do business in Pinellas County. The BMP course is a one-time 3 hour course that all employees are required to take. In order to protect our waters let's be proactive and make sure that we and our lawn services are aware of and follow these practices. If you observe illegal activity you should make the person aware and if it continues you should report it to Pinellas County. We have inserted the BMP guidelines in this newsletter for your reference and to make our landscapers aware. Together we can keep our waters clean.

Happy New Year and thanks for all of your support in my recent re-election campaign. Throughout the election I never stopped working for you and I appreciate your vote of confidence at the ballot box. Elections, especially local elections, really do make a difference! The new gateway signs marking the entrances to the district will be installed in April and new landscaping will be

Early Spring Pool Care

After a chilly, rainy and oftentimes foggy winter, we are all happy that Spring is coming and that we will be using our pools again! For many pool owners, pool care and maintenance has not been high on the priority list. Now is the time to get the pool in shape to avoid algae problems and ensure safe swimming when

you are ready to go in!

The first thing you should do is test the water to see what needs to be balanced. We offer free water tests here at the store if you don't have a pool test kit. If you have a chlorine sanitized pool, now is the time to start shocking the pool weekly with liquid chlorine if you haven't been doing so. For those salt system pool owners, it is critical that you have enough salt in the pool to produce the chlorine you need for sanitization purposes. So make sure to have your salt tested! Now is also the time to take a good look at your filter. If you have a cartridge filter, inspect it to see if it is clean and in good condition. If not, now is a good time to replace it. For sand filters, a good backwash will ensure clear water. For those DE filter owners, now is the time to open the filter up and rinse off the grids (we call this a "split and clean") and then repopulate the pool with DE. It is recommended that this be done twice a year for best water clarity and filter performance, and we suggest spring and fall as the best times to do this maintenance.

If you haven't been brushing your pool and removing debris, get those brushes and nets out! Don't forget to check your pump and skimmer baskets and empty them if necessary. Take a good look (and listen to) your pump to make sure that it is running properly and quietly. And, if you

pump to make sure that it is cut back on the amount of time you ran your pump during the winter, now is the time to have it back to normal run time of 8 hours. We wish everyone an enjoyable spring, and we are here to help if you have any questions or problems getting your pool back to perfect!

ANALYZING THE STATISTICS

Last year in Broadwater 26 waterfront homes and 7 non-waterfront homes sold. As of press time, there are 9 waterfront homes available and 4 non-waterfront homes. This represents a **3 month supply of waterfront homes** and a 7 month supply of non-waterfront homes.

There are 5 waterfront homes under contract: 4 of them are listed between \$650,000 and \$699,900 and the other is listed at \$820,000.

One waterfront home has sold this year at \$580,650. This was the home at 4264 45th St S which went under contract

June 12, 2013. This "short sale" may have been short of money but it certainly wasn't a short time to closing! One non-waterfront home sold this year at \$370,000.

RENOVATIONS AND NEW CONSTRUCTION



Remodeling Industry (NARI) have done a firsttime study looking at resale value and customer satisfaction of a dozen interior and eight exterior projects. Those with the greatest recovery are: New roofing (105%), hardwood refinish (100%), insulation upgrade (95%), new wood floor (91%) and new garage door (87%). By contrast, it was big-ticket items that resulted in the highest level of satisfaction for owners, which NAR has tracked as their "Joy Score."

New Crime Reporting Tool

The Police department now reports crimes to RAIDS Online (www.raidsonline.com) instead of www.crimereports.com. You can customize the area you wish to monitor by entering your address into the filter on the left and designating a radius. You can also choose filter by crime type if you wish. 
Broadwater Neighborhood Watch

FREE 2016 Safe Boating Kit for All Boats and Paddle Craft

The US Coast Guard Auxiliary has issued new 2016 Vessel Safety decals for safe boats including sail and power vessels, kayaks, canoes, row boats and paddle boards, free to boaters when their vessel passes a safe vessel check. Also available are FREE Eckerd College Search and Rescue stickers with phone number and VHF Channel and FREE Paddle Craft vessel identification stickers. Regardless of the type of boat or paddle craft, call me to come over to review the US Coast Guard safe boating requirements list and if your vessels.

sel satisfies the required criteria by using this simple checklist, I will issue a highly visible 2016 Vessel Safety Check decal that lets local police and sheriff patrol boats know that your vessel does not need to be boarded for inspection. If your vessel is deficient in any aspect on the safety list, you have the opportunity to correct the deficiency and I will return to check it out. Deficiencies are NOT reported to any law enforcement office. This inspection/review is done solely for your safety on the water and peace of mind that you have the minimum safety equipment onboard in an emergency. But no matter the ultimate outcome of the free inspection and review, the boater receives the Eckerd College Search and Rescue sticker (EC-SAR) sticker. EC-SAR provides free assistance to boaters (including towing) in Tampa Bay and up to 10 miles offshore in the Gulf and is in service 24/7. When my boat guit on me one day in the Bay, I used the number on my EC-SAR sticker by the helm and called. A rescue boat arrived within 15 minutes. EC-SAR is a true neighborhood benefit. No local boater should be without this sticker. Small boats and paddle craft often turn up in the Bay or in our canal after a storm. It's always a concern of the Coast Guard when an unmarked small boat or paddle craft is found adrift. Authorities often can't be immediately certain if they have an actual search and rescue case for a missing person or if the vessel is simply adrift. A FREE Paddle Craft vessel identification sticker with contact information on the vessel provides value for the owner and, more important, search and rescue teams. Does your first mate know how to take over in an emergency? A current schedule is also included of Boating Skills & Seamanship classes provided by the US Coast Guard Auxiliary every Tuesday, 7 pm on St. Pete Beach at the Warren Webster Building (only 10 to 15 minutes from Broadwater). These 12-week repeating-cycle (start anytime) comprehensive classes provide a sound, safe basis for the beginning boater and a refresher for the senior boater. All materials including the 400 page manual are \$45 per participant or \$60 per couple sharing materials. Important Note for Broadwater Canals: In addition to helping reduce injuries and death on the water, the Vessel Safety Check also helps keep the canals in clean and healthy. Item 15A requires inspection of the bilge for cleanliness. In some cases, non-compliance can occur due to an oil film on the surface water in the bilge that can then get pumped out into the canal during a rain storm. The simple remedy is to obtain an oil absorbent boom or pillow that removes or catches petroleum fluids before they make a dangerous mess in the bilge. Absorbers absorb oil but not water and won't disintegrate even after many uses. A 2-quart absorber costs about \$10. 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




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
