#### 38th St South Improvements

Our 38<sup>th</sup> Street Beautification project is completed! We have much to be proud of and have received very positive feedback from residents. Our team worked very hard on the project from Mike Zito's idea of replacing or covering those ugly bollards with new ones. Not a bad idea but it was more of a temporary cosmetic approach and we felt we needed a long term fix. John Sokol, our Broadwater resident Project Manager. joined Mike and came up with ideas after viewing other bridge railings around St. Petersburg. Tom Ando, Thom Burton and Ted Vandigriff joined the volunteer team. After many meetings amongst ourselves and with the City, we paid \$1500 (the only funds from the Broadwater Civic Association) for a civil engineering firm to work with us and the City to provide some acceptable options. We

then prepared an online survey in June 2016 for all interested Broadwater families to help in the decision making and also pledge money toward the project. 125 responded to the survey and 111 pledged \$28,898. We ended up with 84 donors who contributed \$24,425 which is a very impressive \$290 per donor! The City of St. Petersburg contributed via a beautification grant of \$20,000 and installed the new curb and gutter. If not for this community partnership, this would just be a short story about a failed idea. Instead it is a great example of how a neighborhood can find a solution for a difficult task, overcome obstacles and rally around a civic idea that





really improves the whole neighborhood as well as the northwest side of Maximo Marina.

In order to keep this area beautiful we are requesting the cooperation of all Broadwater residents. If you see anything that could possibly cause damage or create a mess please inform the offenders or call the police non-emergency number. The signs posted in the area say "No Stopping, Standing, or Parking" so there should be no activity there. Most of the local dock and seawall companies have been sent a letter to inform them of the project and requesting their cooperation. Alternatives for delivering materials are to unload on the street at the project site or load at Maximo Park or Gulfport Marina (for a small fee). We are requesting that every Broadwater resident using a dock or seawall company be sure to inform your contractor of the limitations on 38<sup>th</sup> St S. A copy of the letter is available for download on the Broadwater home page under the Useful Links tab.

Thanks to all of you who help beautify Broadwater and our 38<sup>th</sup> St S team of **John Sokol**, **Mike Zito**, **Tom Ando, Thom Burton**, **Ted Vandigriff**, **Kenny Bishop**, **Kelly Bradshaw and the City of St. Petersburg Neighborhood Partnership and Engineering Departments**.

Any excess funds will remain in a separate account for upkeep and other neighborhood improvements. # Real Estate Report

### 2016 YEAR-END SALES STATISTICS

#### Waterfront homes:

21 homes sold, ranging from \$285,000 to \$1,412,500 with an average of \$606,669. Average days to contract was 120. Homes averaged selling at 95% of their last listing price, and 92% of their original listing price (ranged from 79% to 99%, so quite a spread). Average price per square foot was \$271, but the average of course doesn't take into account condition of the home, improvements, or amount of waterfront. One third of the sales were for cash.

#### Non waterfront homes:

18 homes sold, ranging from \$152,500 to \$370,000, with an average of \$289,509. Average days to contract was 45. Homes averaged selling at 101% of last listing price (93% to 125%), which is skewed by distress sales that often sell above their listing price. 35% of the 2016 sales were bank owned properties. Average price per square foot was \$144. 24% of the sales were cash.

#### **DEAR NEIGHBORS,**

Many of the facades in Broadwater have been updated with cultured stone, a material that has been popular with builders of new homes for some time.



Some homeowners have added the stone to columns and small spaces, others have lined the entire bottom front of the house, and yet others have accented fireplaces. In any case, it does update the aging facades.

#### Porches Make Neighbors

Certain neighborhoods are known for their friendliness and interaction, such as the Old Northeast and Kenwood. Architecture contributes to that, since homes with front porches make it easier for someone at home to interact with someone walking their children, their dog or getting some exercise. In other neighborhoods, such as Broadwater, with garages in front of the homes instead of porches, it's all too easy to drive into your garage and never meet the people walking along the street. You see more of your neighbor

across the canal than across the street. Some people are changing that, and making seating areas in front of their homes, such as the one below:



Not only does this give you leisure space facing in opposite directions of the house, but it makes it easier to get to know your neighbors. Depending on the home design some are covered, some uncovered, some paved some not - but it does add a new dimension to the home and neighborhood.



#### St. Petersburg: One of the best walking and biking downtowns in the country!

In their report Core Values: Why American Companies are Moving Downtown, Smart Growth America highlights "walkable, live / work / play neighborhoods" as a major attraction for businesses and their employees. As more companies look for areas with higher than average walk and bike scores, downtown St. Petersburg has a major advantage with both of our walk and bike scores at 91. Our downtown is one of the best walking and biking downtowns in the country, second only to the very largest urban areas and small niche cities like college towns!

For comparison, this puts downtown St. Petersburg above downtown Miami, Atlanta, Indianapolis, Nashville, Denver (walking), San Diego, Seattle, and the downtowns of North Carolina's major cities -Raleigh, Charlotte, and Asheville. Plus, we're not far behind Madison, WI which is considered one of the most walkable and bikeable downtowns in the country with a walk score of 92 and a bike score of 97.

#### Water Resources Progress in Broadwater

Street flooding problems in Broadwater are caused by two sources: heavy rains (when added to groundwater) and leaking sanitary sewers (wastewater). Prior to the closing of the Albert-Whitted Water Reclamation Facility, the city's four sewer reclaim facilities could handle a combined 68 million gallons/day of sewage (wastewater). Currently only three facilities are handling a total of 56 million gallons/day (St. Petersburg wastewater system serves 316,000 with an average of 39 Million Gallons per Day (MGD)) of wastewater flow. An abnormally heavy rainy season (including groundwater) in 2016 and the above noted facts reduced wastewater capacity resulting in 200 million gallons of overflow (total wastewater) being dumped into Boca Ciega Bay and Tampa Bay over a span of 14 months. A recent study indicated that, even on dry days, about 24 million gallons of normal groundwater (reclaimed water, rain, etc.) are inadvertently seeping into leaky sanitary sewers (double the daily normal 12 million gallons of domestic, commercial and industrial wastes), requiring a major project to repair the leaky sanitary (sewage) pipes.

In August of 2016, all of these combined facts resulted in Broadwater having at least 4 flooded intersection areas on 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave. S at 37<sup>th</sup> St.S, at 38<sup>th</sup> St.S, at 39<sup>th</sup> St.S, and at 41<sup>st</sup> St.S, along with a sanitary sewer overflow. One result was a damaged road bed along with flooding on 41<sup>st</sup> St. S near 41<sup>st</sup> Circle causing a month-long road closure. Some residents along 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave. S reported sewage/stormwater flooding coming within an inch of intrusion into their living space. There has been a history of flooding along 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave. S dating back to 2000 that is finally being addressed by the city.

I will continue to advocate for this to happen and to inform the public with the best available and most timely information.

The community has truly embraced the Lakewood High School Jazz Band and even though several of their star musicians have now graduated they have been invited to perform at the Apollo Theater in New York City during the 2018 school year. I have worked with the MIRA (Music Industry and Recording Arts) program at St. Petersburg College and the City of St. Petersburg to fund and produce a recording session where the jazz students will produce their own CD. #### Water Resources Progress in Broadwater Continued from page 8

#### **Progress**

Claude Tankersley, Public Works Administrator, assigned Carlos J. Frey, Senior Professional Engineer, to address Broadwater's Water Resources issues, using his philosophy that he "really likes the idea of partnering with our neighborhoods to be our eyes and ears when we cannot be present". Approximately 50% of Broadwater's 18,867 feet of leaky sewage pipes have been relined and repaired by a cured in-place pipe process. This repair will cure the problem of leaky sewage pipes which in the past allowed groundwater and stormwater to also be collected, thereby reducing capacity. Routine sampling of water quality in Broadwater canals was initiated on 10-24-16 by Carlos Frey with Tom Ando subsequently adding a water quality user-friendly link (under the Useful Links tab) to www.broadwaterfl.org. A \$304 million 2017 Water Resources plan was initiated with a focus on the entire system: Level of Service (LoS), Capacity and Education with the goal of operating without violating FDEP rules and with sufficient capacity in the event of a one-plant closure for up to two weeks. In order to achieve progress before the next rainy season in 2017 (typically July-August), a public meeting was held on 1-3-17 to vet a plan to make rapid improvements to the Southwest Water Reclamation Facility (SWWRF) wastewater capacity by providing 4 NEW underground Injection Wells (IW) to be located at the SWWRF and at the 31st St. S Sports Complex (by 54th Ave S.). Completion will increase capacity of wastewater from 40 MGD to 70 MGD in case of emergency (but would not meet DEP requirements). Initial drilling will likely begin in late February/early March and the first well will "hopefully" be operational by June, 2017.

#### Conclusion

In 2016, Broadwater had a sanitary sewer overflow with stormwater flooding resulting in a public health hazard and property value damage. However, the Water Resources department has made significant progress to increase the Southwest Water Reclamation Facility wastewater capacity which lowers the risk of future sanitary overflows. Unfortunately, Mr. Tankersley has confirmed that increasing improvements in repairing sanitary sewers results in a higher risk of future inadequate flood drainage of stormwater. To date there is no implementation plan to ease this drainage problem. With the repair of the sewage lines and addition of 4 injection wells nearby, the floodwater mixture should contain no sewage. Nevertheless, Broadwater needs to be included in an aggressive plan of specific corrective actions to be defined to improve stormwater drainage along 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave. S and other neighborhood streets.


#### Broadwater Neighborhood Watch




