The Skyway Trail permits nonmotorized vehicles only, with exceptions for EPAMDs, electric bikes meeting Class I, II, or III classifications, electric wheelchairs, maintenance vehicles, law enforcement, and emergency vehicles. E-Bike are classified as bikes under Florida State Statute 316.20655 and are classified in the following way:

Class I: Pedal-assist only, where the pedal-assist cuts off at 20 mph, and the user must physically pedal to go faster.

Class II: Throttle on demand operates by a throttle, by pedal-assist or both, where the throttle cuts off at 20 mph and the user must pedal to go faster.

Class III: Pedal-assist only, where the pedal-assist cuts off at 28 mph and the user must pedal to go faster. **Per St. Pete Code of Ordinances Sec 26-404(f) e-scooters are also allowed on shared use trails with specific exceptions for the North Bay Tail, the Pier, and the Pinellas Trail west of 34th St.**

MARKET MUSINGS...

So far this year, all but one of the waterfront and non waterfront sales have been for cash. The one conventionally financed sale happened to also be the highest sale price, and highest sale price per square foot. Two of the four homes that have sold went for 100% of list price, one for 97% of list price and one for 82% of list price. Likewise three of the four that sold were on the market 2 days or less. One of those was not on the market at all and sold off market but was added to the MLS when it closed for statistical purposes.

The average sale price and price per square foot for waterfront homes is down versus this same time period last year significantly. The average sale price of \$1,096,125 is a 29.5% reduction from the same time period last year which showed an average sale price of \$1,556,250. Similarly, the sale price per square foot decreased from \$709/sq ft to \$548/ sq ft, a 22.7% decrease. This is due in part to two of the four

sales being "lot value" sales and one being a highly motivated seller who sold for less than one million as the effects of last year's storms continue to shape the market.

The news isn't all gloomy. Non-waterfront sales are up in Broadwater with the average sale price and sale price per square foot up 33.8% and 36.3% over this same time period last year. We'll continue to monitor the disparity as we enter the summer and report on any trends we see shifting or developing in the coming months.

So how did I do? I've been working with Sharon and reading her Musings for 20 years now. It may take a bit to find my own voice

but l've got a tremendous example to follow.

We welcome your input as Tami and I keep The Simms Team moving forward.

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BROADWATER NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

With school out of session we usually see an uptick in criminal activity. Please be alert to your surroundings and report any unusual activity to the police by calling the non-emergency line at 727-893-7780. Keep your garage door down and lock your vehicles and home when unattended. Be sure to let your contractors and guests know to secure their vehicles as well. Crimes of opportunity can happen at any time of the day so if something does not quite seem right report it. Volunteer to be part of the Broadwater Neighborhood Watch by contacting Mark Ewin at 727-804-3828 or ewinml@msn.com. The St Petersburg Police have several resources to help you help them fight crime. Eagle Eye is a program that LOCK allows you to register your camera with the SPP allowing them to contact you for video that may help them solve a crime occurring nearby. BLOCK CAPTAINS

Broadwater's 23 Block Captains are your street level representatives and are the lifeblood of Broadwater. Each street or area has a Block Captain assigned to be your first contact for neighborhood questions or concerns. INJURED BIRD, WHO DO YOU CALL?



Birds in Helping Hands are a licensed wildlife rehabilitator located in Seminole providing 24/7 wildlife care. SHORT TERM RENTALS IN BROADWATER

For residential properties within the City of St. Petersburg, short-term rentals (durations of less than 30 days) may only be rented a maximum of three times within any consecutive 365-day period. Short-term rentals exceeding this allowance are a violation of city code. If you are having an issue with a short term rental, it is sometimes best to inform the owner of the code. If that doesn't work, contact the codes department, or submit via SeeClickFix or the Mayor's Action Line.

CONCERNED ABOUT OUR WATERWAYS?

Early detection of red tide blooms allows researchers at FWC (Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission) to provide warning to coastal residents in the area, continue research, and predict seasonal events. We have community volunteers in our neighborhood to expand the spatial coverage of the FWC's monitoring program by collecting water samples from areas where red tide or any other water quality issue is suspected. Because of limited state personnel, boats and other limited resources, the program relies on volunteers to help monitor inshore bays and offshore coastal waters off the Gulf of Mexico.

Two water samples can be collected every couple of weeks in two different locations within our neighborhood. If you feel there is an indication of red tide or any other water quality issue, please text Mel Moss at 727-276-9345. Additional information can be found at www.broadwaterfl.org
