

# Treasurer's Report

Submitted by Vicki Linkovich

As of November 1, 2012 Cash and Certificates of Deposit total \$36, 503.

Revenues of \$11,632 include \$800 reimbursement from Maximo Marina for the expense to mulch the 46<sup>th</sup> Ave. entrance, membership dues in the amount of \$4,320 and a \$500 grant from the City of St. Petersburg for our Neighborhood Watch program. Advertising income of \$3,425 is below the same time last year due to timing of the receipt of funds. Expenses of \$8,221 include newsletter expenses of \$2,263, \$499 for Neighborhood Watch shirts which were funded by the \$500 grant, \$401 for Neighborhood Watch auto magnetic signs, block captain shirts for \$440 and storage expenses of \$706.



Your dues are appreciated and support the many activities of the Broadwater Civic Association. Thanks to our 264 paid members



in 2012. We ended up at 50% matching last year's total. The 2013 membership form is included in this newsletter. Please mail it in the envelope provided or pay in person at the Holiday Party on December 14<sup>th</sup>. # **Green LEEDership**

In October, the U.S. Green Building Council's Florida Gulf Coast Chapter awarded St. Petersburg the "Municipality of the Year" and recognized the city for "Outstanding Green Government" for its commitment to green initiatives. You may recall that St. Pete was named the first Green City in Florida in 2007.



# Marmoleum?

Speaking of green, we recently came across a flooring material that we hadn't heard of before. Apparently, marmoleum is a natural linoleum regarded as one of the greenest floors on the market. It's supposedly bio-based, non-toxic, antimicrobial, very durable and easy to maintain. It comes in sheets or squares, and can produce a variety of interesting designs. An environmentally friendly product made from linseed, we're seeing it in laundry rooms, kitchens, baths, and even in commercial spaces.

# **Reworking Spaces**

The preference for a large, open space rather than a collection of smaller single-purpose rooms has been evident for quite some time, and we've seen many Broadwater renovations that open up the kitchen, living, dining and family rooms into a multifunctional space. Think of alcoves and areas rather than individual rooms, so that multiple areas can "share" the same space - longer views, easier conversation.

Our increasingly electronic and mobile world is also changing our space needs. Many Broadwater residents use one or two of the bedrooms for a home office, some incorporating a library there. With Kindles and other electronic books becoming more popular, shelf after shelf of purchased novels are no longer needed. With iPads and other tablets, we're often using our computer at the kitchen counter or out on the patio instead of being tied to a home computer in the office. We can send documents that may need to be printed wirelessly from our tablet or laptop. All those file cabinets for paid bills, insurance policies, etc? Now we can scan them and save them in the Cloud, or for receipts we can just use the camera in our smart phones. So we have less need for a dedicated space for computer, monitor, printer and tons of cords and cables. We may have more need for convenient outlets for charging all of our mobile equipment.

How to be apart but nearby? How to add a reading nook, a window seat or an inglenook? Homeowners are increasingly concerned about expenses, from property taxes to insurance to utility cost. While you're at it, consider wider doorways, decorative grab bars and other features that accommodate aging homeowners, whether it's you or your parents.

# Trends in BW Waterfront Sales

The average sale price of a waterfront home here in Broadwater has been increasing over the last three years, as has the average price per square foot:

<u>Year</u>	#Sales	Avg	\$/sf
2012	16	\$446,469	\$194
2011	18	\$435,868	\$185
2010	11	\$425,173	\$166

In 2010 there were two sales in the \$200,000s - none have sold in that range in either 2011 or 2012. The majority of sales during 2010 and 2011 were below \$400,000

(64% and 67%). So far in 2012 the majority of sales have been in the \$400,000-\$500,000 range (50%).

Short sales have also decreased: there were 4 in 2010, 5 in 2011 and only 1 so far in 2012. One home under contract is a short sale and none of the active homes in the MLS are short sales. It has been the case in most of our sales that neighborhoods that have worked through the short sales have had increased prices and reduced inventory.

There has been just one non-waterfront sale this year in Broadwater, which is not enough to determine a trend.




## CAREFEST 2012
