#### 34<sup>TH</sup> ST SOUTH REDEVELOPMENT

SUBMITTED BY GARY JONES, CITY OF ST. PETERSBURG

For over 2 years the leaders of your Broadwater Civic Association and leaders of other neighborhood associations in the area, along with your City Council Representative Steve Kornell, have been behind the scenes drivers of an effort to encourage the City of St. Petersburg to commit resources to improve the economic climate for 34<sup>th</sup> Street South.

The effort has paid off and I am pleased, as a senior planner of the City of St Petersburg's Economic Development Division, to be part of a joint effort with businesses, property owners and neighborhood leaders focused on developing an improvement plan for 34th Street South. The plan area includes the corridor from 30th Ave. S to 54th Ave S. Connectivity of this corridor with commercial waterfront properties to the south will also be explored. The plan will incorporate strategies for economic development, transportation, streetscape, site development and marketing and will be completed by the end of 2013. The overall goals of the plan are threefold:

- 1. Improve the retail and dining experience
- 2. Create more redevelopment opportunities
- 3. Increase the profits of businesses



Public input is solicited and is very important to this planning process. A steering committee has been formed to help guide the planning process and create the final plan acceptable to the entire community. The steering committee will meet bi-weekly and a dedicated website at <a href="https://www.stpete.org/34">www.stpete.org/34</a> will be frequently updated with information as the process evolves.

The kickoff meeting on April 23rd at the SPC Allstate Center was a great success with approximately 250 people in attendance. It was the largest turnout for such a meeting that I have seen. The Broadwater Neighborhood had the highest attendance of any neighborhood with over 60 residents. Mayor Foster, Council Members Kornell and Newton, and Council Chair Nurse all expressed astonishment at the size of the turnout. They emphasized the importance of what we were doing and encouraged all to continue their involvement. Neighborhood Presidents from Broadwater, Lakewood Estates and Greater Pinellas Point spoke about the many unique assets of the area and many of the area business owners spoke to the enthusiastic crowd.

I look forward to working with Broadwater and others involved as we develop the plan. Thank you for supporting the City, local businesses and your neighborhood leadership in this effort. ## **Market Condition Update**

We're still seeing a bifurcated market homes that are priced well are selling in days, often with multiple offers. Homes that are priced high offer no sense of urgency to buyers and they stay on the market for months, even years in some cases. Inventory is still low, so buyers need to be ready to act quickly when they see a property they want. Cash is still king. In weighing offers, sellers look at the amount to be financed and the risk of a low appraisal or continuing delays from the lenders, and often choose to accept a cash offer that is lower than some of the offers with financing.

We're seeing more international buyers, some still living in their home country, some who have moved to the U.S. Many of them are buying multiple properties, and most of them are paying cash. Their family and friends often follow. The international

buyers used to be primarily from Western Europe but now we're seeing a lot from Eastern Europe and from the Pacific Rim.

#### SWEET TOOTH? NO PROBLEM!

Most people consider having a "sweet tooth" as being a road block to losing weight or eating healthy. However, satisfying your craving for sugar the natural way can be very good for your body, mind and spirit. Loading up on tasty fruits, which may be right in your own yard, is a great way to satisfy that sugar craving while getting lots of healthy benefits.

Here is what fruit can offer that other sugary treats cannot:

- Lots of fiber, which can aid digestion and lower cholesterol. Fiber keeps you feeling full, which is often a key to weight loss. The fiber in fruit also helps slow and regulate the processing of the natural sugar in the body, avoiding the extreme highs and lows of blood sugar levels that you get with manufactured sugar.
- Plenty of essential vitamins and minerals, including potassium, a nutrient that helps build strong bones and lower blood pressure. Fruit also contains important disease-fighting antioxidants (especially those dark berries) and many (especially citrus fruit and melons) have a high water content to keep you better hydrated.
- Antioxidant-rich fruits also help protect your skin from free radicals and skin damage.

It is no secret that Americans consume far too much manufactured sugar; much of it is also "hidden" in processed food and drinks. Let's start making an easy transition to eating more natural foods, and many of our health and weight loss challenges will magically disappear! For starters, try swapping out some fruit for your typical sugary treat. You do not have to go cold turkey; take it a step at a time and slowly make it a habit. This is especially important for kids - teach them now and they will have good habits for life.

Now that things have started to heat up outside, try freezing some fruit like mangos, grapes and cherries and enjoy a frozen treat. Better yet, blend them together (you may want to add some water or non-dairy milk for creaminess) and freeze them around a popsicle stick for a homemade delicious and nutritious treat.
