Smart Home Features

A smart home is, by definition, a home equipped with lighting, heating and electronic devices that can be controlled remotely by smart phone or computer. Fully-automated residences can be prohibitively expensive, but economic smart-home features liked these can bridge the gap:

Nest Learning Thermostat or Ecobee3 "learn" the homeowner's temperature preferences throughout the day, and can automatically adjust on schedule - or they can be controlled manually via smartphone, tablet or computer.

Cree Connected LED light bulb dims, brightens and turns on or off remotely. (This requires the bulb and a compatible hub, WiFi connection and a mobile device.)

August Smart Lock remotely controls a door's deadbolt, so you can ditch the keys and know that you locked the door.

MLS Status Change

As of 11/1/16, our regional MLS eliminated the "Active With Contract (AWC)" status for listings. Now, listings can only be "Active" or "Pending". We fully support

DEAR NEIGHBORS,

It's been another interesting year for real estate and for Broadwater. Waterfront sales have been a bit slower this year than last (1.8 sales/month vs 2.2 sales/month). As usual, averages don't tell the whole story. April (6) and May (4) sales were just over half the total sales year to date. Since May, only 3 waterfront homes have closed. Nonwaterfront homes, in contrast, have nearly tripled since last year, from 0.6 sales/month to 2.2 sales/month. The supply of homes has increased, with a current 6.5 months of waterfront homes and 3.8 months of nonwaterfront homes. In most other waterfront neighborhoods, the trend is the opposite - the supply of homes has decreased.

Cash sales remove some of the uncertainties of a financed sale, but cash sales can still be subject to an appraisal, if specified in the contract. Some neighborhoods, such as downtown, have had over 50% cash sales this year in Broadwater 37% of the waterfront sales were cash, and 31% of the non-waterfront sales.

Overall in our market, there are many less distress sales than there were in past years. This year in Broadwater there was 1 waterfront distress sale and 6 non-waterfront distress sales. Actively on the market there is only 1 distress sale, a waterfront home that has been reduced in price from \$999,000 to \$899,900.

25% of the waterfront homes listed had a price reduction in the last month; 1/3 of non-waterfront homes listed were reduced. There are buyers waiting for homes, but they generally

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won't pay more than they feel the location and amenities merit. Excluding distress sales, waterfront sales in Broadwater this year sold at 96% of their last listing price, or 92% of their original listing price. Non-waterfront sales were 97% of their last listing price, 96% of their original listing price.

We're still seeing lots of renovations and improvements going on. The work along the west side of 38th StS between 46th and 48th Avenues has started - should be really nice looking when they've finished.

After years of increasing flood insurance rates from the national flood insurance program, this year we switched to a private flood insurer and saved a LOT of money! In the national program, Florida is subsidizing the other states - for private companies, they use actuarial data just for Florida, resulting in the savings.

Thank you all for your continuing business and trust. We're happy to be neighbors!



this change, for a variety of reasons. The AWC status was intended to allow a home with a significant contingency (like the sale of the buyer's home) to continue to be marketed to prospective buyers, who could place a backup offer that could either "kick out" the original contract, or would fall into place if a contingency hadn't been met. In reality, the status was used when that wasn't the case and there was little likelihood that a backup offer would take precedence. What resulted was properties showing up on Realtor.com, Zillow.com and others as "Active" when they were truly under contract. It also affected the reporting of days on the market, since AWC continued to accrue (Pending stops the count).

Did You Change the A/C Filters?

If you have a hard time remembering to change them regularly, or remembering what size to buy, you might consider www.FilterEasy.com. Set p an account and they'll deliver the appropriate filter(s) to your door at the right intervals and charge them to your credit card. It really is easy!

RAIDS Crime Reporting Tool

The Police department now reports crimes to Community Crime Map Online (http://communitycrimemap.com/). You can customize the area you wish to monitor by entering your address into the filter on the left and designating a radius. You can also choose filter by crime type if you wish. You can also sign up to receive daily emails alerting you to crime in the area. There are many other useful tools and you have the ability to report crimes such as theft, criminal mischief, harassing phone calls, lost property, identity theft, or vehicle burglary online at www.stpete.org/police

Wastewater



This past summer and fall we experienced a number of flooding and overflowing manhole issues as well as sewage dumps in our waters due to inadequate system capacity and leaky pipes. Rather than pointing fingers, Broadwater has taken a proactive position to try to help the city solve issues specifically affecting our neighborhood. Thanks go out to **Block Captain Philip Creter** who has been working closely with city officials to learn more about our wastewater system while providing data and exploring ways to monitor future events as they apply to Broadwater. Phil was also instrumental in having Broadwater ca-

nals added to the weekly water testing schedule so we can be aware of unsafe conditions. He also toured one of the treatment plants to get a better understanding of the process. With Phil's help, we are working on ways that residents can become educated and become a resource for the city to help solve wastewater and drainage issues. We feel this approach will benefit Broadwater and the City of St. Petersburg in the future.

WINTER POOL CARE AND HAPPY HOLIDAYS

Winter is right around the corner and most Floridians look forward to the cooler weather and festivities of this beautiful season. In this part of Florida, we can usually enjoy our pools throughout the winter since the sun is warm and our days usually are warm. Winter pool care is, in many ways, much easier than in the summer. Cooler nighttime temperatures and less rain allow us to run our pumps a little less (we recommend 6 hours in the Winter vs 8-10 hours in the Summer) and to reduce our chlorine tablet (or Salt) use. Algae growth is much less common, and there is no reason not to enjoy that sparkling blue water! Although many of our winter afternoons are warm and sunny, the cooler nighttime temperatures result in cooler water. Two simple



ways to extend your swimming season are to use a Solar Cover or install a Pool Heater. A Solar Cover is a very cost effective way to warm the water, but some families prefer the convenience of a Pool Heater. The new generation of Pool Heaters are much more energy efficient than they used to be, and prices have become more reasonable. If you have propane or natural gas, a Gas Heater is a great option. For those without propane or natural gas, you can use an electric Heat Pump. Come talk to us to see which option is best for you.


