CONCERNED ABOUT OUR WATERWAYS?

Early detection of red tide blooms allows researchers at FWC (Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission) to provide warning to coastal residents in the area, continue research, and predict seasonal events. We have community volunteers in our neighborhood to expand the spatial coverage of the FWC's monitoring program by collecting water samples from areas where red tide or any other water quality issue is suspected. Because of limited state personnel, boats and other limited resources, the program relies on volunteers to help monitor inshore bays and offshore coastal waters off the Gulf of Mexico.

Two water samples can be collected every couple of weeks in two different locations within our neighborhood. If you feel there is an indication of red tide or any other water quality issue, please text Mel Moss at 727-276-9345. Additional information can be found at www.broadwaterfl.org

In Florida, the species that cause most red tides is Karenia brevis (K brevis)

Reminder: By city ordinance, customers may place both trash and recycling containers at the curb as early as 7 PM the night before collection. Containers must be moved from the street and placed by the side or rear of the customer's residence by 7 PM the day of collection.

Fourth Quarter 2023

Here are some interesting tidbits from *Realtor® Magazine*:

Sustainable Upgrades by Budget

A recent study from Rewiring America and Thumbtack gives a breakdown of these sustainable upgrades by budget and the potential utility bill savings:

Under \$500:

- Energy-efficient lighting (\$241 cost est., \$200/yr potential savings)
- Smart thermostat (\$240 cost est., \$100/yr potential savings)

\$1,000 - \$5,000:

- Install EV charger (\$2,230 cost est., \$1,000 potential savings plus 30% tax credit
- Double-pane windows
 (\$1,569 cost est. for 5-8
 windows, \$6,000 potential
 savings plus 30% tax credit)

\$5,000 - \$9,500

- Heat pump water heater (\$5,280 cost est., \$120/yr potential savings)
- New insulation (\$9,469 cost est., \$400/yr potential savings)

\$9,500 - \$20,000:

- Rooftop solar panels (\$9,640 cost est., \$100/yr potential savings)
- Heat pump (\$16,588 cost est., \$330/yr potential savings)



MARKET MUSINGS...

So far this year there have been 12 waterfront sales ranging from \$1,000,000 to \$3,111,143 with an average of \$1,436,304. The same period last year had 19 sales, ranging from \$1,100,000 to \$2,225,000 with an average of \$1,505,529. 67% of the sales were for cash.

Average days on market was 106 (from 0 to 292) - a huge difference from the 19 days on market a year ago. Sales have ranged from 80% of last list price to 100%, for an average of 89%. Of the 12 sales there were 12 different listing agents and 12 different selling agents.

As of November 15 there were 4 active waterfront listings, ranging from \$1,199,000 to \$3,200,000, with an average price of \$2,124,750. Just as last year, there have been no waterfront sales under \$1 Million.

This year there have been 9 non-waterfront sales, ranging from \$560,000 to \$1.165,000, with an average sale price of \$771,600. The same period last year there were 7 sales, ranging from \$590,000

to \$815,000 with an average of \$692,500. This is an increase of 11%.

56% of the sales this year were cash sales. The average sale to last listing price was 98% with a range of 94% to 100%. The average price per square foot was \$395 with a range of \$340 to \$444. The average days to contract was 33 days with a range of 1 day to 99 days. Of the nine sales there were 9 different listing agents.

As of November 15 there were 3 homes actively on the market, from \$750,000 to \$870,000 with an average listing price of \$823,333. Two homes are under contract at list prices of \$700,000 (on the market




256 days) and \$850,000 (on the market for 21 days).

The conforming loan limit for 2023 for Pinellas County is \$726,200. Loans above that would be considered jumbo loans.

CRIME AND CODES REPORT MONITORING TOOL



Stat Map is an interactive tool that displays the locations of citizen requests submitted to the Mayor's Action Center and via SeeClickFix, as well the locations of code violations and police calls for service. This tool allows you to view the concerns people in and around your neighborhood have, create alerts for any new reports, and see changes over time. You can also highlight specific activity in council districts and neighborhoods. Under Pins, you can see the trends in reports for Police Calls, Code Violations or SeeClickFix. Create an alert for a particular area by creating an account, typing an ad-

dress or selecting an area. You can then decide how big you want to make your watch area. Stat Map will give you greater access to the information the city collects, while showing trends within our community. You can download Stat Map and view a tutorial at www.stpete.org/police

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
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
